Narratives:

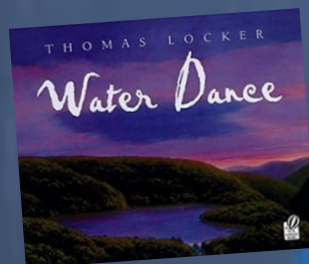
Story writing, recounts, character and setting descriptions and fables.

Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation:

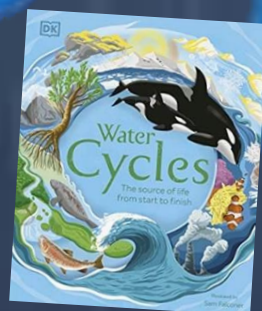
Apostrophes for possession and contraction

Mental strategies in addition and subtraction, including the use of place value.

Understand and use mental multiplication and division strategies.

Find non-unit fractions of amounts, equivalent fractions and simplifying.

Recognise properties of 2D shapes, including angles.

Understand the relationship between multiplication and division, and then between addition and subtraction.

Computing

To design, write and debug programs.

To write programs that accomplish simple goals.

To solve problems by breaking them down into smaller parts

PSHE

How can we manage our feelings?

How everyday things can affect feelings.

How feelings change over time and can be experienced at different levels of intensity

The importance of expressing feelings and how they can be expressed in different ways

Geography

Learn about the water cycle and its importance.

Explain terms such as evaporation, condensation and precipitation.

Science

Identify and compare materials that are solids, liquids and gases.

Investigate what happens to solids, liquids and gasses when they are heated or cooled.

Use terminology such as evaporation and condensation

Set up fair tests and observe and report outcomes.

Learn about the artist Hokusai.

Use sketchbooks to generate ideas and record thoughts and observations.

Analyse and describe colour and painting techniques in artists' work.

Manipulate materials to achieve desired effects.
