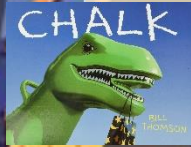


The Great Escape!

Children will be revising sentence level skills, developing their vocabulary and stamina for writing.

Children will write descriptions, recounts and narratives.

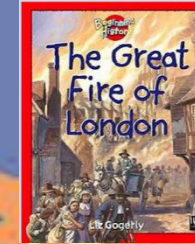


Phonics

Children will be revisiting phase 5 sounds, Y1 tricky words and practising segmenting and blending. Children will also be starting to learn Y2 spellings and Y2 tricky words.

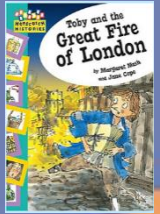
Art

Children will be creating their own London skylines using silhouette and collage techniques. They will also be learning about artist John Michael Wright and sketching portraits.



History

Children will learn about daily life around the time of the Great Fire of London, the main events and changes after the event. Children will explore different sources and develop their understanding of chronology and cause and effect.



D&T

Children will be learning about stable structures.

They will investigate different structures, design, make and evaluate a stable structure design based off the fairy tale, Goldilocks and The Three Bears.

PSHE

Children will be learning about families and relationships. We will be learning how to show respect for different families and how we overcome issues in friendships.

Maths

- Identify multiples of 10
- Add and subtract multiples of 10
- Counting and representing numbers 20-99
- Compare, order and partition 2-digit numbers.
- Fluency of addition and subtraction facts within 10 and 20.

PE

Children will be practicing their throwing and catching and other basic ball skills. They will also be developing other skills, such as hopping, skipping, dodging and balancing.

Computing

Online Safety

Children will be learning about how to keep safe online and who to speak to if they need help.

They will also be learning about the importance of a good, unique password and creating suitable future passwords.

Music

Children will be learning about African music and learning about musical vocabulary including pulse, pitch, tempo and texture. They will also be learning the song Hands, Feet, Heart and begin to follow notes to play a Glockenspiel.

RE

Why is light an important symbol?

Children will be learning about narratives where light is an important symbol. They will also be recognising the narratives used by Christians, Hindus and Jews and how they reflect their key beliefs. Children will be learning about examples of how Christians, Hindus and Jews use beliefs (and the symbolism of light) to guide their daily lives.

Science

Uses of Everyday Materials

Children will be learning about different materials and looking at the suitability of materials for particular uses. Children will be investigating different materials strength and stretchiness and recognising that the shape of some solid objects can be changed.
