Reading

Maths

- Place value of 5-digit numbers.
- Add and subtract multiples of 10, 100 and 1000
- Use written addition to add two 4-digit numbers.
- Add and subtract 2- 3- and 4-digit numbers mentally.
- Understand place value in decimal numbers.
- $\times$ and $\div$ numbers with up to two decimal places by 10 and 100.
- $\times$ and $\div$ by 0 and 100
- Add and subtract 0.1 and 0.01.
- Multiply and divide by 4 by doubling or halving twice.
- Use mental multiplication strategies to multiply by 20, 25 and 9.
- Revise converting 12-hour clock times to 24-hour clock times.
- Find a time a given number of minutes or hours and minutes later.
- Calculate time intervals using 24-hour clock format.
- Measure lengths in mm and convert to cm.
- Find perimeters in cm and convert cm to m.
- Solve subtraction using written methods for 3-digit and 4-digit numbers.
- Use counting up as a strategy to perform mental subtraction.
- Find change from a multiple of ten pounds using counting up.



History

This term, children will learn about Ancient Greece, exploring its key periods, gods and important cities such as Athens and Sparta. They will also discover democracy, philosophy and the lasting impact of Ancient Greek achievements on our world.



Computing

This term, children will learn how to search the internet effectively, judge whether online information can be trusted and understand how search engines work. They will also explore copyright and how to use online images and information responsibly.



PSHE

How can I support my mind and body as I grow?

This term, children will learn about making healthy choices, staying active and looking after their physical and mental wellbeing. They will also explore different emotions, how to manage them and where to seek support when needed.

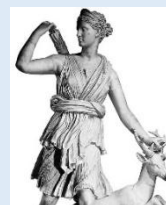
Personal Development

Children will learn how to play together confidently and de-escalate from disagreements. Children will learn how to make good moral decisions.

This term, children will learn how to adapt and prepare recipes to make Greek kebabs, considering their nutritional content. They will develop practical food preparation skills and design their own product labels.



Science

This term, children will learn about different forces, including gravity, air resistance and water resistance, and how these affect objects. They will also explore how levers can make it easier to lift and move objects.



PE

Tag Rugby – All Year 5

This term, children will develop their tag rugby skills, learning how to attack, pass, run with the ball and create space. They will also learn how to defend as a team, apply the rules and use their skills effectively in competitive games.

Swimming – Sapphire Class

Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. Use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]. Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

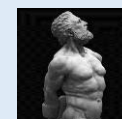
Dance – Ocean Class
